RABBI DANIEL LEV



Kona Beth Shalom is delighted to welcome back **Rabbi Daniel Lev** to lead High Holiday services. He lives in Honolulu with his wife, **Margaret Walkover**.

Rabbi Lev began serving the Jewish communities in Northern California and the San Francisco Bay Area 37 years ago. As both a Rabbi and Maggid (Jewish story teller), he was inspired by his mentors, **Rabbis Shlomo Carlebach** (z"l), and **Zalman Schachter Shalomi** (z"l), to dedicate himself to sharing the wild joy and earthy delight of Jewishness with everyone. He uses song, story, Jewish ritual, meditation, and lots of humor to convey the everyday holiness of Jewish tradition.

You can view him telling a story at a gathering of the Aquarian Minyan in San Francisco on the occasion of their 36th Anniversary, on <u>YouTube</u>.

Rabbi Lev received rabbinical ordination in 2005 from a private Beit Din and from Rabbi Zalman Schachter-Shalomi (z"l). He led High Holiday Services for Kona Beth Shalom in 2007, 2008, 2016 and 2017 and has been back to Kona to lead Shabbat services, study groups and shabbatons for Kona Beth Shalom to the delight of all who have attended. Dr. Lev received his PhD in 1994 from the Wright Institute of Graduate Psychology in Berkeley, California. Having moved from Berkeley, California to Hawaii in 2014 where he served the Kaiser Permanente community in Oakland as a chronic pain specialist, he now offers that service in private practice on Oahu.

Once again, Shari returns to Kona as High Holidays cantorial soloist alongside Rabbi Lev. Shari was president of Congregation Kona Beth Shalom from 2006 through 2012 when she moved to Japan to assume the role of Associate Professor at Hirosaki National University in Japan. As president of KBS, Shari encouraged many members to study Torah and to learn Hebrew. She officiated more than a dozen Bat and Bar Mitzvahs here, even several after she moved back to Japan. Shari was born in Chicago but moved with her family to Ashiya, Japan (Kobe area) at the age of nine. She was educated there as well as in the United States with a particular interest in and advanced degrees in language studies. In 1998, Shari and her life partner, Alice Bratton, moved to Hawaii.

AUTUMN 2017

Nella & Alan Silverman donated 15 new siddurim to the congregation.

Former KBS president, **Shari Berman**, now Professor at Hirosaki National University, Japan, returned to Kona to co-lead High Holiday services along with **Rabbi Daniel Lev.**

Hebrew School begins for the year with four KBS students, and **Trina Yerlick** and **Louise Feldman** teaching. That fall **Mira Korach** taught the students folk dancing, and **Shai Yerlick** made *latkes* for class.

On October 8th we held the **KBS Annual Meeting** at **Ruth Ader's** home, followed by a **Sukkot celebration.** Past KBS President **Barry Blum** presented a brief history of KBS with an emphasis on how much the congregation thrived and grew during the past year, and acknowledged KBS's active

web site, more music at services, additional Torah readers, a good sound system, and delicious food and beverages at potlucks.



Aloha KBS Ohana,

As a 41 year resident of Hawaii Island, I have seen many transformations. Our most recent east rift zone lava eruption and subsequent collapse of Halema`uma`u crater are certainly the most striking. We in the Kona districts have had hardships related to very poor air quality, but we are fortunate that our homes remain. Over 700 homes have been destroyed in the past three months, in lower Puna. We are constantly being reminded that our existence on this physical plane is tenuous at best. We are once again recognizing that life is short, and we need to hold those we love close. Included in that is the expansion of our circles. Our Jewish community is ready for expansion. We welcome you to join us this upcoming year, 5779, and to expand your journey into Judaism. I call on each and every one of you to become more active within our congregation. Every person is important to our small congregation.

Many thanks to **Vivienne Aronowitz** for her leadership over the past year & a half. Great thanks to our **board of directors** for all that they do. You make my job much easier. Mahalo to **Dr. Barry Blum** and **Alysa Freeman** for putting together this newsletter. Mahalo to **Alan Silverman** for organizing the donations for lava relief. Shana Tova to all and we hope to welcome you to our events and gatherings, starting again in October.







OUR WEB SITE

In Memoriam

SAUL LELAH. Born in Singapore on January 17, 1928, he was raised there until age 13 when he escaped on the last French troop ship before the Japanese invasion. He continued his growing up in Bombay, India where there was a huge Jewish community and he eventually married and immigrated to Israel soon after Israel became a State. After 6 years of a very hard life, working for a camera company beneath the Negev Desert, he immigrated to England. Eventually immigrating to the United States, he owned his own high tech machine shop in the San Fernando Valley in California before retiring and moving to Hawaii in 1989. Saul is survived by his wife, **Nadine**, his daughter, **Tova**, and his sons, **Reuben**, **Jack** and **David**. He passed away in Waikoloa on May 11, 2018. He will be remembered for his wonderful adventurous stories and worldly wisdom.

ARIE SHLOMO GILDENER was born on April 21, 1943 in what was then Palestine or Lebanon and later immigrated to the United States, to live in New Jersey. In the 1960s he moved to Canada. Then, in the late 1970s he moved here to Hawaii where he met his wife, **Michele**. They lived in South Kona. Arie's upbeat personality and his considerable skills enabled him to fix just about anything and everything. He eventually serviced just about all the coffee roasters in Kona. He passed away on July 23, 2018. Our hearts go out to his family including **Michele**, his children **Aaron**, **Suzanne**, **Hannah** and **Allan**, his brother **Eldad**, and 9 grandchildren.

THE LAST JEWS OF POLNÁ. Every year, Congregation Kona Beth Shalom takes upon itself the responsibility of reciting Kaddish for the last Jewish residents of Polná in the Czech Republic. Our beloved Torah scroll came from there. The names of each of those 95 individuals of blessed memory are printed on slips of paper along with their ages when they were taken by the Nazis in 1943. One of those slips of paper is given to each individual attending our Yizkor Service so that those names may be read aloud. There is no one else to do this.
